Dear Parents/Guardians of Livonia Virtual Elementary Students,

The Michigan Department of Education’s annual state testing will begin in April, when we return from Spring Break. Students in the State of Michigan take a combination of M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress), PSAT 8/9 and SAT. **There is no option to take the assessment remotely so all students will be asked to come into their schools for testing.** Students will not test every day during the testing window. Each school is creating a schedule to allow for minimum disruption to teaching and learning. Specific test dates will be available through your child’s school. Students will take the following state assessments during the designated testing windows:

Grades	M-STEP Tests Given	State’s Testing Window Each window was extended an additional week by the State.
3, 4, 6	ELA (Reading, Writing), Math	April 26 – June 4
5	ELA (Reading, Writing), Math, Science, Social Studies	April 12 – May 21

Some specifics for LV students:

- Students will test with their LV teacher at their LV teacher’s worksite.
- Labs and classrooms will be sanitized for students prior to testing, as we do each evening for our in-person students.
- Students may go outside for a break. They will not mix with another classroom.
- Transportation will be provided by parents.
- There will be no live teaching on testing dates but there will be an asynchronous assignment on testing days.
- If a student needs to come back and finish a test, the school will communicate those make up times.

M-STEP is an untimed, online assessment, that students will take using Chromebooks or computers in their school’s computer lab. Teachers prepare students for the M-STEP by teaching our district’s curriculum for ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies, this assessment is aligned to the State Standards. Also, teachers have explored the test items and provided their students an opportunity to practice grade-level specific online sample items.

As a district we look at how our students perform on these assessments to determine how well we are preparing students to be College and Career Ready. We also utilize the results to determine supports and courses for students. We recognize that not everyone will feel comfortable with testing in-person and request that families contact their student’s school if they have concerns. Although there are no repercussions for not testing, we do encourage families to allow their students to test.
