

UPDATED MDHHS QUARANTINE GUIDANCE

PROTOCOL FOR COVID-19 EXPOSURE

POSITIVE CASES

Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 and/or display COVID-19 symptoms should isolate regardless of vaccination status:

- Monitor for symptoms for days 0-10; AND
- Isolate at home for days 0-5 (day "0" is the day symptoms begin or day test was taken for those without symptoms); AND
- If symptoms have **improved** or **no new symptoms** developed, 24-hours fever-free, you may return to school, while wearing a well-fitting mask, for days 6-10.

CLOSE CONTACT AT SCHOOL

The Wayne County Health Department is adopting the new self-quarantine and isolation guidelines from MDHHS for schools. Additionally, Wayne County HD is adopting the following updated protocol for quarantines:

- Monitor symptoms for 10 days.
- Test if symptoms develop.
- Consider wearing a mask for 10 days after exposure, especially around individuals with high risk.

SYMPTOM MONITORING RECOMMENDATIONS

- **Do not** attend school or work if you are not feeling well (COVID-19 Screening Tool).
- Watch for symptoms, such as fever, sore/scratchy throat, cough, shortness of breath or other COVID-19 symptoms.
- If symptoms develop, get tested immediately and isolate until receiving test results. If test is positive, then follow isolation protocol and contact your school administration immediately.

CLOSE CONTACT AT HOME

If the COVID-19 exposure occurred within the household, the student or staff member, regardless of vaccination status, should adhere to the following protocol:

1. Monitor symptoms for 10 days.
2. Test 3-7 days after exposure or if symptoms develop.
3. Wear a mask around others for 10 days after exposure. If a mask cannot be worn, the individual should home quarantine for 10 days after exposure.
